Thanks to our loyal supporters, this financial year has again been a relatively good one.

Total income (net of expenses) in the first half year was £47,363. This is down on last year, however last year included significant funds from corporate donors or trusts. Excluding these amounts, income is comparable with last year.

For some time VTT policy has been that all Unrestricted funds sent out to CRP should be used to support Spinal Cord Injury patients. VTT has now changed this policy to include patients in the Mother and Child Unit, the William and Marie Taylor Inclusive School and/or with Orthotics and Prosthetics, hence the importance of donations being Unrestricted'.

Valerie's visit to Coombe Bissett:-

Over eight days Valerie had a busy time including visiting Horatio's Garden at Salisbury Hospital, speaking at school and church events and briefing supporters from across the Chalke Valley. Although her visit did not focus on fund raising, around £9,000 (excluding any Gift Aid) was donated by generous supporters.

Sadly Margaret Henley, a paediatrician and keen supporter of VTT/CRP died recently. She first visited CRP in 2011 with her husband, the local Team Rector, Revd Canon David Henley, and both of them did so much to encourage the churches of the Chalke Valley to support Valerie's work. It was her wish that half of the Retiring Collection at her funeral would be donated to VTT.

The Bangladesh Association of Glasgow held their Annual Dinner in the Glasgow Science Centre on the 1st October. Valerie was the main Guest speaker at the event which also included the Leader of Glasgow City Council, a local MP and the Chairman of the National Theatre of Scotland.
The event began with a curry meal and was followed by the very moving "MEMORAI". a play about the 1971 Liberation War. This was performed by BAG members and dancers. The production was subsequently performed at the Tramway Theatre in Glasgow as part of the National Theatre of Scotland.
Valerie gave a very good update on the work of CRP. The BAG regard VTT as their main charity for support. Dr. Rose Mary Harley, VTT member, worked very hard on the evening to raise money for VTT from a raffle.

2016 Annual Supporters Meeting –

Brian Woodgate, Administrator, reports:

Once again, the Annual Meeting was very well attended by Trustees, members and supporters, who were treated to an excellent 'light' curry lunch beforehand that was provided by Mokhtar Hussain, Daphne Woolnough and other helpers.

The Chairman welcomed all present and, in particular, Valerie Taylor, and Shafiq-ul-Islam, CRP Executive Director. He also thanked Area Co-ordinators for their help, and St. Paul's Church Centre for their assistance. .

The Treasurer pointed out that income in the past year totaled £270,000, but some concern had been raised by the increase in Restricted Funds – 51% Last year - which reduce CRP's flexibility in how the money is used. In many cases the Trust was used as a secure conduit of funds into Bangladesh. Expenses of the Trust in supporting this work were £2,992.

Shafiq-ul-Islam addressed the meeting and outlined and outlined some key achievements included improved patient administration, Bangladesh Government acknowledgment of CRP's national value, new courses, sports development. Infrastructure developments including construction of Rajshahi and Chittagong centres, the Prosthetics and Orthotics school, a hostel for students and outpatients and the new workshop at Ganakbari. Future work includes work on the Rajshahi and Barisal divisional centres, establishing facilities in government hospitals for Spinal Cord Injury and Mental health patients; a permanent centre in Moulvibazar, and CRP out-stations in Pabna, Mymensingh, Rangpur, Rangamati and Khulna;

Valerie reported on her very successful visit to the US, which raised \$60,000 from an event arranged by the Bangladeshi family who donated land for the CRP. Other events took place with the Bangladeshi community in Washington, DC. She also commented on some other key developments and events of the past year including: A) motorised wheelchairs are now being built at the CRP workshop; B) On the 400th anniversary of Shakespeare, a disabled cast, including 3 CRP patients, performed Romeo and Juliet in Dhaka; C) It was a shame that Bangladesh will not be able to compete in the Paralympics. However CRP has been asked to set up the national Bangladesh Para sports organization; D) A rising concern is the number of cases where women have suffered severe injury through scarves catching in rickshaw wheels – a simple redesign of rickshaws is under way.
