#### FACTS OF A FESTIVE

The Bangla calendar was promulgated by Mughal Emperor Akbar the Great. The Bengali New Year begins at dawn. In urban areas the day opens with cultural programme - combining singing, recitation, performance of classical music. The Shova Jatra has the appearance of a Mardi Gras parade embellished with motifs whose roots lie in the local customs of this alluvial plains. Boishakhi mela or the traditional fair is a fun fare of food, fun and frolic - one enjoys various local snacks, Pithas (traditional cakes), puppetry, circus, handicrafts etc. Probably the oldest and most symbolic custom is opening of new ledger (Haalkhata) by businesses, clearing out the old. Women adorn themselves with traditional Saree and flowers, men put on their best Punjabi and Pajama. Pitha, Panta Bhaat, Bhortas (mashed preparation of various vegetables/fishes) and fried Hilsa fish are some of the delicacies. which are enjoyed on this day. BAG aspires to showcase all this elements of this special day to the Scottish population of Glasgow on 30th May 2015.
